World Migratory Bird Days

The 13th May and 14th October 2023 mark World Migratory Bird Day, international days for migratory birds. These UN observances highlight our common water resources and their importance for migratory birds.

Marine ecosystems are increasingly under threat around the World, as are the migratory birds that depend on them. Increased human demand for water as well as pollution and climate change have a direct impact on the availability of clean water and the conservation status of many migratory birds.

World Migratory Bird Day features an annual awareness campaign that highlights the need to conserve migratory birds and their habitats. The campaign has a global reach and helps raise international awareness of the threats facing migratory birds, as well as their ecological importance, and the need for international cooperation to conserve them. The stamp and the artist

Ivalo Abelsen from Nuuk has illustrated our stamp, which is issued in honour of these international days for migratory birds. This is her seventh stamp for Tusass Greenland. It was issued four days prior to the observance.

The Golden Plover, masterfully reproduced by Ivalo on the stamp, is a rare breeding bird that breeds locally at Itoqqortoormiit (Scoresbysund). It is also a migratory guest in Southeast and Southwest Greenland. The Golden Plover arrives at the breeding grounds in April-May and can usually be seen on its migration until September.

The migratory bird lives near the mountains along the coast, as well as in both freshwater and seawater. It has a wingspan of 67-76 cms, weighs 140-201 grammes and can reach a length of 27 cms. The Golden Plover feeds on various small animals such as insects, snails and worms and has a life expectancy up to 12 years. The female can lay up to eight eggs, once a year.

About the artist

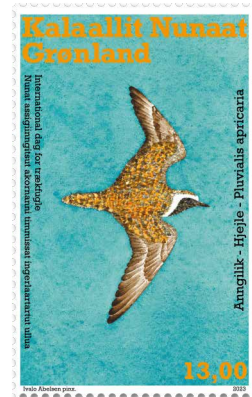
Ivalo Abelsen was born in Nuuk in 1971. She studied at the School of Art in Nuuk and earned a Master's degree in Culture and Social History, minoring in crafts and design. She is also certified to teach at high school and university level and has taught visual arts and design.

She is a member of the Greenlandic artists association, KIMIK. She has held solo exhibitions in several Greenlandic towns, as well as the Bank of Greenland in Nuuk and the Greenlandic House in Århus, Denmark. Moreover, she has participated in collective exhibitions in the Greenland Culture House, Katusaq, Nuuk Art Museum, Greenland National Museum, and the Greenlandic House in Copenhagen. She also participated in the collective exhibition 'Essence', which toured Greenland, Denmark, the Faroe Islands and Iceland.

Ivalo Abelsen has completed adornment assignments for BankNordik in Nuuk and is represented in several books on art in Greenland. She is a recipient of the Self-Government's Cultural Work Scholarship, and grants from the Nuna foundation, the Aage V. Jensen Foundation. Today, she is an Assistant Professor at the University of Greenland, Ilisimatusarfik, in the Institute for Learning and a guest teacher at the School of Art in Nuuk. In addition, she is a teacher at the upper secondary school GUX in Nuuk. She also registers art at the Kommuneqarfiik Sermersooq and Nuuk Art Museum.

Extra definitive series featuring Greenland's Coat of Arms

For the first time since 1963–64, the Greenlandic postal service is issuing a definitive series that does not bear the regent's portrait. This is a supplement to the definitive series featuring her Majesty the Queen's portrait, which was launched in 2012 and last extended with a denomination in 2021.

The extra definitive series bears the coat of arms of Greenland, illustrated by Kristoffer Gudbrand. The stamps are designed by Bertil Skov Jørgensen. The denominations of the first two stamps in this extra definitive series are DKK 0.50 and DKK 16. In the coming years, the definitive series Greenland Coat of Arms will be continually expanded to include several denominations.

Many thanks to Jakob Rohmann Hard, Chief of Protocol for the Greenland Self-Government authorities, for his tremendous assistance in obtaining the version of the Greenland Coat of Arms reproduced in this extra definitive series.

About the artist behind the stamps

Bertil Skov Jørgensen was born in Kolding in 1968. He was educated at the Royal Danish Academy of Fine Arts under the academy's first female professor, Vibeke Menche Nielsen, and trained as an engraver under the legendary Martin Mörck.

Since 1992, Bertil Skov Jørgensen has participated extensively in exhibitions in Denmark. He made his stamp debut for Post Danmark in 2000 and his first stamp for Greenland was issued in 2009. In 2013 he created the 75th anniversary stamp for Tusass Greenland.

Bertil Skov Jørgensen is a distinctive graphic artist. Whether it is drawings, paintings or installation works, they all revolve around the graphic arts or graphics. HRH Prince Christian's 18th birthday was also celebrated in Greenland

The deep commitment of the Royal House to the history, contemporary times and culture of Greenland underscores the strong ties between the Royal House and the Greenlandic people. Concurrently, Tusass Greenland has a long tradition of marking royal family birthdays, anniversaries and weddings by issuing a Greenlandic stamp.

His Royal Highness Prince Christian became 18 on Sunday 15th October 2023. The attractive Greenlandic stamp issued to mark the occasion was created from an original photo by court photographer Franne Voigt. The anorak worn by the prince on the stamp was sewn by the recently deceased Astrid Fleischer Rex.

HRH Prince Christian's full name and title is Christian Valdemar Henri John, Prince of Denmark, Count of Monpezat. Born on 15th October, 2005, he is the son of Crown Prince Frederik and his wife, the Australian-born Crown Princess Mary. He is the grandson of Queen Margrethe II and the older brother of Princess Isabella Henrietta Ingrid Margrethe, born in 2007 and the twins Prince Vincent Frederik Minik Alexander and Princess Josephine Sophia Ivalo Mathilda, born in 2011.

Prince Christian is second in succession to the Danish throne and will become Crown Prince when his father ascends the throne. When Prince Christian becomes King one day, it will be as Christian XI.

In August 2011, Prince Christian became the first ever member of the Danish Royal Family to attend a Danish state primary school at Tranegårdskolen in Gentofte Municipality.

Christian was confirmed on 15th May 2021 in Fredensborg Palace Church. Prince Christian is expected to complete his upper secondary education at Ordrup Gymnasium (high school) in June 2024.

Prince Christian's only visit to Greenland to date took place in August 2014 during the Crown Prince Family's summer cruise to Greenland. During their stay, the Crown Prince Family visited a number of locations, including South Greenland and the capital Nuuk.

For Prince Christian's birthday party on Sunday 15th October 2023, two 18-year-old teenagers from each municipality in Denmark, as well as the Faroe Islands and Greenland, were invited. They all had the opportunity to participate in the gala dinner hosted by Prince Christian's grandmother, Queen Margrethe II. From Greenland, Ivalu Grønvoold and Angititaa Motzfeldt from Aasiaat and Narsaq, respectively, participated. Angititaa grew up in Qaanaaq, North Greenland. Participating in the birthday celebrations was a great experience for both of them.

About the artist

Frane Voigt was born in 1967 in Ry, Denmark, and is a fashion and portrait photographer. The many magazines he has worked for include Danish and foreign magazines such as Euroman, Eurowoman, ELLE, Vanity Fair and Vogue.

Amongst others, he has created photographic portraits of former UN Secretary-General and former Danish Prime Minister Anders Fog Rasmussen, former Danish Prime Minister Helle Thorning-Schmidt, EU Commissioner Magrethe Vestager, as well as Danish actors Mads Mikkelsen, Nicolai Coster-Waldau, Trine Dyrholm, Sidse Babett Knudsen and Connie Nielsen, etc.

He has been photographing the Danish Royal Family since 2009, both officially and privately. In collaboration with the publisher Gyldendal, he released a book about the royal yacht 'Kongeskibet Dannebrog' in 2016. In 2018, he co-published the book 'HKH Kronprins Frederik' in collaboration with the publisher Lindhardt and Ringhof. The book 'Kongeskibet Dannebrog' offers especially magical images of the Greenlandic nature, which is represented throughout the book. In 2021, he released his book 'MARY H.K.H.' in collaboration with the publisher Politikens forlag.

This year's two Greenlandic Christmas stamps are designed by a fairly young artist who has not previously tackled the many challenges of stamp art. In stamp design terms she is, therefore, a debutant. Nevertheless, Kristine Spore Kreutzmann is experienced in the Greenlandic art world, especially in design art. As she stated in the book 'KIMIK Ukiut 20 Ár', released by Milik Publishing in 2016 to mark the 20th anniversary of the Greenlandic artists association:

"I have inherited my artistic abilities from my family, both on my mother's and father's side. As a child, I often watched my mother, graphic artist Nina Spore Kreutzmann, create her art."

Kristine Spore Kreutzmann (born in 1989) is an independent ceramic designer and artist living in Nuuk. She is chairperson of Greenland's Artists' Association, KIMI, and sits on the board of Greenland's upcoming National Gallery and the Sermeq Foundation. She teaches sculpture/ceramics in Eqqumiitsulionermik Ilinniartarfik (Art School) in Nuuk.

NEW in Greenland: Prestige booklets

Several other postal services have issued Prestige booklets for a number of years. They are much more than booklets containing printed stamp sheets; they are small history books with diverse themes.

Now it is Tusass Greenland's turn to issue Greenland's first Prestige booklet, which we are doing in style. 2023 marks the 50th anniversary of the first Greenlandic stamps featuring Her Majesty the Queen's portrait. The historical stamps were issued on the Regent's 33rd birthday on 16th April 1973, just over fifteen months after her accession to the throne on 14th January 1972, when she was proclaimed Queen Margrethe II. Subsequently, be-

coming the head of state for Denmark, the Faroe Islands and Greenland.

The Prestige booklet contains colour reproductions of all previous Greenlandic stamps bearing the Queen's portrait. These stamps were issued in Greenland between 1973 and 2021. In addition, the Prestige booklet contains three se-tenants of the portrait stamp from the current definitive series. This stamp portrait of the Monarch was created in 2012 by the renowned engraver and illustrator Martin Mörck from a photograph by court photographer Steen Brogaard. However, the denominations are new, namely DKK 12 and DKK 24.

About the graphic designer

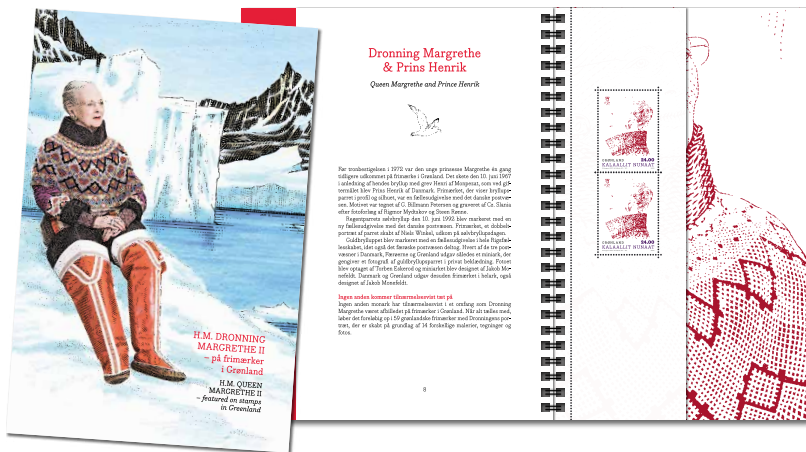
Ella Clausen was trained as a graphic designer in 2003 and took further training in Creativity and Design in 2016. She worked for many years for PostNord Danmark, where she was responsible for, among other things, the preparation of various stamp designs. Among other things, she has designed the Danish souvenir sheet that marked the Queen's 50th anniversary in 2022, as well as a number of periodicals and annual publications for the Danish postal service.

The four photos of the White-tailed Eagles were all taken by Carsten Egevang, biologist and researcher at Greenland's Nature Institute in Nuuk. Through his field work in various parts of the country, he has developed a unique selection of nature pictures. He took the two photos of a White-tailed Eagle against a blue sky a number of years ago in Arsuk in July. The two photos set against an icy backdrop were taken at Nuuk in December.

The cash payment cannot therefore be replaced by other stamps. The maximum annual exchange of unused stamps per customer must not exceed DKK 50,000 in nominal value.

For each received package of Greenland stamps for postmarking by Tusass Greenland Filatelia, a handling charge of DKK 20.00 will apply. Orders paid with exchanged postage stamps shall be subject to the same handling charge as for single sales orders.

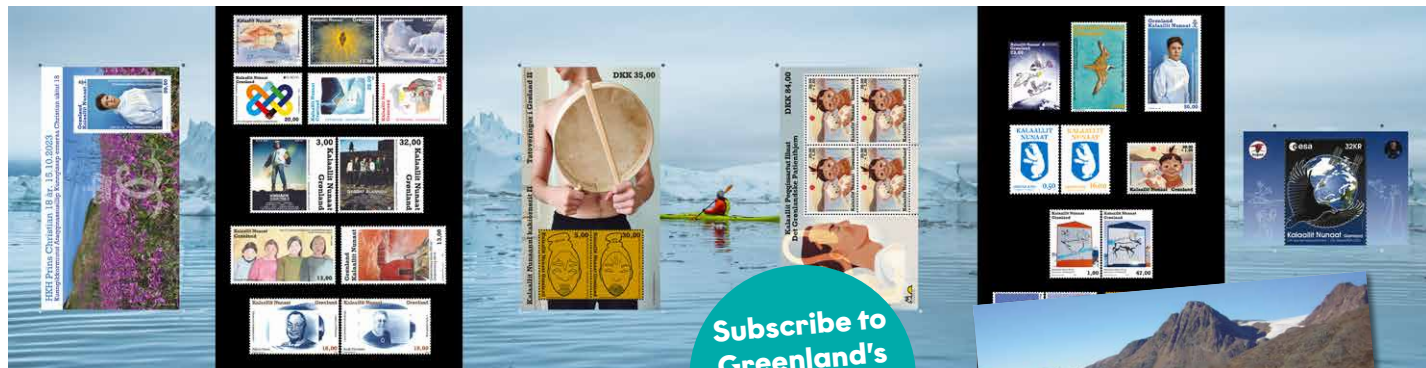

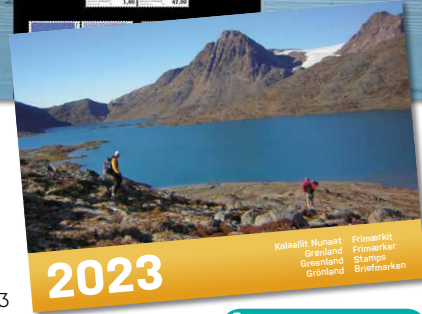
